Meet Our Student Interns



from Barry University

CFCE works with local universities to provide learning opportunities by facilitating behavioral health field placements and supervision practicums for *Bachelor* and *Masters* level students. We want to highlight and celebrate the work, commitment, passion and dedication of two of our Barry University Master's Student Interns <u>Tonya Robinson</u> and <u>Kurtia Williams</u>. Both were placed at our CFCE shelter in May of 2021; we are grateful and proud of their work.



Tonya & Kurtia demonstrated exceptional drive to serve striving foster care youth who have been impacted by challenging experiences in their lives. Each youth living at the CFCE shelter is connected to therapeutic, interactive learning and other services. Some of the challenges at the shelter can include lack of participation in services, frequent elopement behaviors and even bullying.

Tonya and Kurtia were assigned to facilitate groups on topics such as: social, emotional and behavioral skills; social engagement; learning interpersonal, self-management and relationship skills; social/self-awareness, conflict resolution, and self-esteem among others. These skills can drive emotional development and increase self-empowerment in youth. They served as group facilitators using a specific evidence-based curriculum.

Immediately after groups started, Shelter Clinician Sandia Marcellon and staff began to notice positive changes in youth. Group participation began with two youth and quickly increased to all youth attending. Ms. Marcellon reported that youth frequently approached her to inquire about the day/time of the groups to ensure their attendance.

Here are some noticeable changes we saw in the youth:

- 1. Seeking to participate in group activities and high level of engagement and enjoyment for the activity
- 2. Initiating and communicating ideas for group activities
- 3. Demonstrating ability to resolve conflicts among one another
- 4. Ability to empower peers and frequent display of support for each other as opposed to bullying
- 5. Maintaining communication with peers while on elopement to keep staff informed
- 6. Displaying attitude of cooperation and initiative to decorate shelter and making it feel more home-like
- 7. Frequent displays demonstrating skills of self-awareness when conflicts arise

Girls Cottage Mural






CFCE's Girl's Cottage is a home where teen ladies can rebuild themselves and grow into the young women they strive to become. This mural inspires the continuation of that process.

The Mural Process






All those involved in the process wanted the mural to represent the teen ladies and what they stood for.

Foster Parent Recruitment





The Center for Family and Child Enrichment (CFCE) in conjunction with Citrus Family Care Network, announced its intent to reach into the community to locate families and households who are interested in fostering children. The initial meeting was held on October 13, 2021 at the CFCE headquarters in Miami Gardens. The purpose of the meeting was to form a steering committee representative of clergy and other child welfare minded community members who are willing to lead the campaign to recruit foster parents.

On this day, several local pastors attended the meeting including Bishop Baskin of New Way Fellowship Church, Reverend Clinton Preston of Peaceful Zion Missionary Baptist Church and Ms. Doretha Nichson, lay minister of Unity of Miami Gardens. Representatives of Citrus Family Care Network and Explore Foster Miami were also present.

Many other clergy from the area have expressed an interest in participating in this project as well. We anticipate another gathering of the group in early January. This is such an important mission that we look forward to having a much larger work group and invite any and all that have an interest in the welfare of children to attend.

National Adoption Day is an annual event where children who have been waiting for a forever family have their dreams come true. Because thousands of children celebrate their adoptions on the same day, National Adoption Day helps to bring attention to the many children in foster care. Adoption specialists work diligently to find families wanting to provide safe, loving and stable homes for children in care. The decision to adopt is momentous and many families make the decision to go on this journey. The process of adoption takes patience, dedication and teamwork to ensure that all documents are timely received and processed. Families who make the commitment to go through the adoption process must complete a PRIDE Adoption training course, and undergo a home study and background process.

Every child's story is unique but the one thing they all have in common is the desire to have a forever family. Whether it's a foster parent, relative, or a family seeking to adopt a child, adoption specialists carefully screen families in the hopes of finding a match for each child. Every child deserves to have a family that they can call their own no matter the child's age or special needs. This year CFCE finalized nine adoptions ranging from a nine-month old baby to a child with autism.

On National Adoption Day families, judges, Guardian Ad Litems, children, adoption specialists, adoption attorneys and guests come together to celebrate the legal commitment that is made between a family and a child in care. This year's virtual National Adoption Day event marks the first day of the rest of the lives of children who now have a family they can call their own.

The Walking One Stop event is where partnering agencies distribute literature to educate community constituents about available opportunities for employment, health insurance, community resources, and other available services. Services also include legal offense expungement, medical and behavioral health care services and registering to access health insurance.

Other child care services that they support are free educational materials for children in each household, promoting awareness of community services, promoting children's literacy, vocational education programs, community safety, crime stoppers and much more. Participating in November's Walking One Stop event were CFCE Program Director Mary Williams, Behavioral Health Clinical Coordinator Lance Jackson and others.
